

## Otokahe Wakanyeza Wawicayakapi Early Childhood Screening

Otokahe Wakanyeza wawicayakapi de kaspapisni qa ecatana obezapi toked Wakanyeza he ecahya ecagepi qa waonspepi.

Early Childhood Screening is a free and simple check of how your child is growing, developing and learning.

Waniyetu yamnipi kinhan wawicayakapi cinpi, kta Wakanyeza waniyetu yamnipi waunspepi Tipi itokabtu hehantu tuka Woope waeconwicakiyapi.\*

Screening at 3 is preferred, but a child may be screened between the ages of 3 and the start of kindergarten as required by law.\*

What to expect at a screening appointment

Tuwe wounspe wakantupi wan wawicayakapi kte. A trained professional will check:

- Wayakapi qa Nahonpi Vision and hearing
- Hanskapi qa thekpi Height and weight
- Pejuta un wicapapi Immunizations (shots)
- Tanka qa cistinna Conica bdaska Large and small muscles
- Wiyukcanpi, iapi qa wohdakapi unspepi
  Thinking, language and communication skills
- Oyate Mniciyapi qa Wacanteikta ituwastepi kta Social and emotional development

De wakanyeza awanwicayakapi wosdodye dena tokatakiya sompa wo'okahnige owicakiyapi okihipi , wounspe tipi itokab yapi sni ecin tu. This screening may help you link to other free learning opportunities, such as pre-kindergarten programming, Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE), Minnesota early learning scholarships for high quality care and education, Head Start, Home Visiting, and Early Childhood Special Education.

\*Your child may also be screened at their Head Start, Tribal Head Start, Child and Teen Check-ups or a clinic that offers developmental screening. Parents may conscientiously object to screening (decline or refuse). Minnesota Statutes 142D.091.

# Dakota cultural meaning of key terms

#### Ecadan Wakanyeza awicabdezapi (Early Childhood Screening)

It is important for Dakota Infants to be examined/screened at an early age.

#### Icagapi (Growing)

It is important for Dakota Infants to be examined and tracked as they start to grow up.

#### Tanyan Icaga tokata tanyan Icagapi (Developing or development)

It is imperative to keep a good record as they develop in early to higher ages.

#### Wasdoyapi (Learning)

Early childhood health record keeping is important for them to grow up healthy.

#### Oyate ektakiya tawacin zaniyan icagapi (Social emotional development)

Early childhood socialization is important to develop, social is getting along well with other children.
