Questions You Can Answer by Using ECLDS



1. In which ECE programs did children participate prior to kindergarten?

ECLDS can be used to learn which public early care and education programs kindergarteners in your county or school district participated in before entering kindergarten. Look more closely at groupings of kids with common characteristics or experiences.

Discover counts of kids who participated in more than one program at a time for their maximum support and learning.

2. Are kindergartners and their families receiving economic or food assistance?

Identify if kindergarteners and their families in your county or school district are receiving economic or food assistance. You can also find out if they participate in public ECE programs according to the type of assistance received.

3. What are the educational results for third grade students?

Find out third graders' math and reading assessment proficiency in relation to other factors. You may take a closer look at groupings of kids with common characteristics or experiences.

4. At what age are children usually screened in your county?

Get a sense of how old kids in your county or school district were when they were first screened for potential health or developmental concerns, and related early care and family factors.

5. What are the demographics of children in your county?
